- Identifying a ranking from within the topics raised. The most important topic was then to be illustrated by tearing paper apart (and glueing the pieces on the posters).

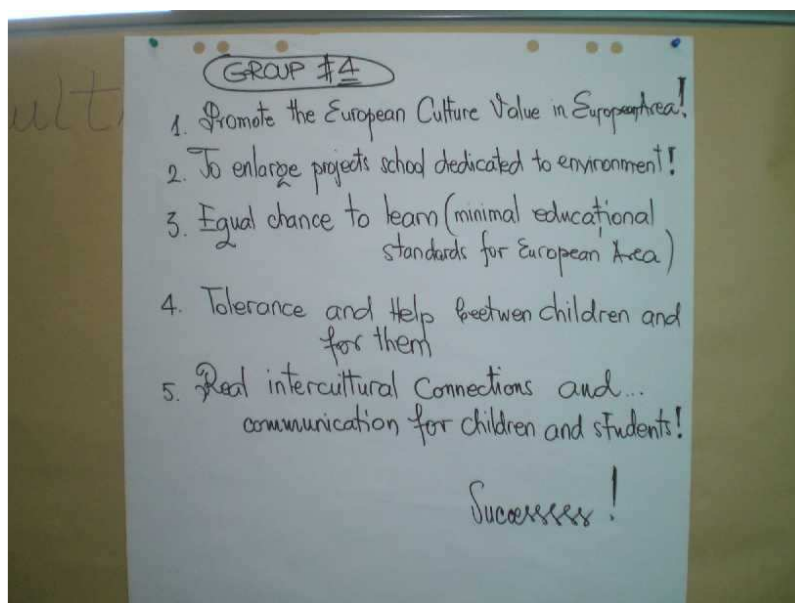
