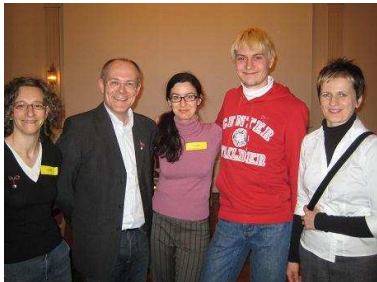

2. Aims of the Start-Workshop and Participants

The aims of the **aces** Start-Workshop are:

- to bring together students and teachers from all **aces** projects 2007 in order to get to know each other
- to learn more about the partners, about the involved countries and also the “European dimension” within the field of education
- to share and reflect on project experiences
- to plan further steps for the common work

Working methods and language

Various working methods such as plenary sessions, group work and an outdoor activity are used.

As to the group work, the composition of groups are changed in the different working sessions in order to have mixed groups of students and teachers, national teams, groups according to the project themes and finally groups involving the project partners only.

These settings allow a creative and dialogue-oriented interaction and a fruitful exchange between participants and furthermore foster self-directed learning processes.

The common working language is English.

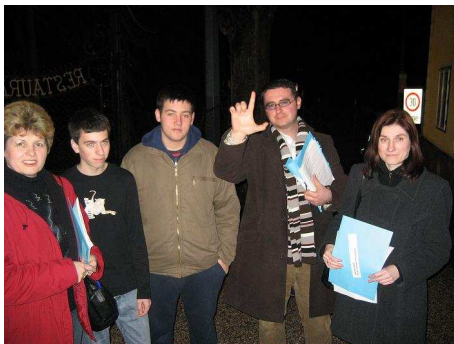

■ **“The Quality – Project Coaching”**

The participants of aCES projects with similar thematic focusses exchange on their project contents, aims and methods (peer coaching). Sharing opinions on the topic and on educational strategies can help to learn from each other, from other experiences and should lead to the improvement the own project work and quality of the projects.

▪ **“Intercultural Evening – Eurocities Quiz”**

The game is prepared and carried out in national teams of the eight participating countries. Each team selects a town of their home country and performs it in three “living postcards”. The other national teams guess the right city.

Friday, 2nd March 2007

▪ **“Project Talks”**

In this session the partners in the 22 projects have time to discuss and further develop their projects: to clarify open questions, agree on organisational things, discuss quality improvement and new ideas gained during the workshop as well as the project implementation in class/school and the organisation of partner visits.

▪ **“Teachers Café”**

To discuss methods and give impulses for joint project and group work as well suggestions for the aCES programme, the participating teachers and the aCES-coordination have discussion rounds without students.



Results – Suggestions concerning aCES-Workshops:

- Activities just for students at the workshops
- Age group (projects, workshop)?
- Language difficulties – English compulsory (insist on it)
- Free-time activities (planned, not planned)
- More movement, sport (?)
- Produce something (?)
- Involve teachers in workshop planning/implementation: collect suggestions for facilitation, ask for needs of teachers before
- More time for working with project partners

Results – Suggestion concerning aCES-Programme:

- Requirements for the application: sometimes not easy to fill in and plan everything in advance, but also helpful to think of different aspects of the project
- The online “Partner Finder” proved to be very helpful and approx. 50% of the schools found their partners due to the use of the Partner Finder.

▪ **“Discovery Tour – Traces in Vienna”**

Each group takes a self-directed walk through the city with a special perception focus and brings back 8 things/symbols from this tour to show their experiences in Vienna to the others.



7.1 Handouts for Participants

7.1.1 „Get together & find new friends“

Welcome to Vienna!

We are happy that you have come to the workshop and are sure that you are already eager to get to know the other participants!

To find a group of new friends, start to look for them at 18.00 h.

The **meeting point** of your group is:

→ the **“children’s play area” in the breakfast/dining-room** (downstairs)

Your group is: **Group “A”**

Please remember this for the following days!

If you have not found your group by 18.15, come to the hostel reception! The aces-team will help you.

Group activity:

- 1 member of the group has a **“treasure map”** indicating the destination where the group has to go. At this place you will meet additional new friends.
Your group should **arrive at this place at 18.35** (it takes only a few minutes to walk there)!

- Before leaving for this place the group should think about the following and write down the answer:

Imagine that it is Saturday 3rd March and you have been at the aces-workshop for the last 3 days. How was it to take part in the workshop?

Agree on 2 adjectives (can be positive or negative) in the group and write them on the paper strip which one of the group members will have in his letter.

- One person has a card giving the group name (alphabetic character: A, B, ...).

Those who have these additional things in their letters (treasure map, paper strip, group card): bring them to the group’s meeting point and later to the place where the group has to go!!

7.1.2 „Europe – the making of ...“

→ First, please choose (1.) a moderator, (2.) a timekeeper, (3.) a writer and (4.) a presenter for this working session among the members of your group.

Working phases:

1. Individual phase (3 min)
2. Story telling (3 min for each person / 20 min altogether)
3. Discussion and flipchart (20 min)
4. Plenary presentation of working group results (1 min per group)

1. Individual phase (3 minutes)

Please take 3 minutes to think of **one important personal experience** (a special memory, situation, activity) that was for you “a moment of Europe” or in which you felt “European”.

What was it and why are you connecting it with the notion of Europe?

If you wish, you can make notes for yourself here:

2. Story telling (3 minutes for each person / max. 20 min altogether)

Please tell your experience shortly to your group members.

For this presentation each group member has a maximum of 3 minutes.

3. Discussion and flipchart (max. 20 min)

After you all have heard the experiences from your colleagues: what do you think are collective elements and shared conceptions in all these stories?

What do you think should be the basic values of OUR COMMON Europe?

Collect all mentioned and discussed key elements.

Afterwards the group agrees on the “**5 most important essentials for Europe**” and the writer notes them on the flipchart.

All groups bring their flipcharts to the following session in Plenary at 12.30 h:

4. Plenary Presentation (1 min)

The presenter of the group is kindly asked to present the results (flipchart) of the group in plenary and should focus on the real important issues (each speaker has 1 min).

7.1.3 „Project Coaching“

3 Working phases for EACH project (30 min):

5. Presentation of the partnership project / Focuses for the listeners (10 min)
6. Peer coaching: reflection and feedback from colleagues (20 min)

The **“Pedagogical Principles”** of the UN-Decade ‘Education for Sustainable Development’ can be used as supporting guideline for the reflection process on the quality of the projects! High quality education should be characterised by:

- **Interdisciplinary and holistic:** connecting learning goals and contents across the separate disciplines and subjects; learning for sustainable development embedded in the whole curriculum, not as a separate subject.
- **Values-driven:** sharing the values and principles underpinning sustainable development; making visible standards and norms to be able to discuss, review and select values.
- **Critical thinking and problem solving:** leading to confidence in addressing the dilemmas and challenges of sustainable development and to consensual problem solving.
- **Multi-method:** word, art, drama, debate, experience, ... different pedagogies which model the processes; initiate activities for sustainable development through a multi-method design of classes/education.
- **Participatory decision-making:** learners participate in decisions on how they are to learn; enlarge possibilities of learners to decide on WHAT to learn and HOW to organise learning processes.
- **Locally relevant:** addressing local as well as global issues, and using the language(s) which learners most commonly use; taking up the living conditions of learners by broaching the issue of their regional cultures.

1. Presentation of the partnership project (10 minutes)

A presenter of the partnership project briefly describes the project to others in the group paying particular attention to: partners, content, aims, activities, methods.

The listeners – students and teachers from the other projects – follow this presentation bearing a special filter/focus in mind:

Teachers: What is the pedagogical potential of this project?

Students: In which activities would I really like to participate? Why?

2. Peer coaching: reflection and feedback from colleagues (circa 10 + 10 minutes)

Colleagues (students and teachers) give their feedback to the concerned partnership project from their point of view. They can also include own (educational) experiences in this reflection process.

10 min on: What I like very much about your project!

10 min on: I have got an idea for you / for your project!

Project partners may collect these ideas from the colleagues and – during the “Project Talks” session – think of whether and how to integrate them in their own projects.

7.1.4 „Eurocities - Quiz“

→ Find and get together with the colleagues from your own country; this activity is carried out in national teams.

Preparation for the Eurocities - Quiz (before it starts at 20.30 h)

1. Choose a town of your country and think of how to represent it in **three “living post cards”**. Find a pantomimic way of sculpturing the three pictures with people (e.g. two group members can build a bridge whereas another one gives a famous tower). And don't forget: it's only pictures you create – no movie! So: don't move!

The themes of your “post cards” can be famous geographic spots, important historic events or typical folkloristic activities (in this town).

Prepare to represent this town – the postcards – in 3 different levels of difficulty:

- difficult to be recognized by others
- a little easier to be recognized
- easy to be recognized by others

This representation may include as many persons from the national team as you like. You may even ask additional participants to help if needed (but give them a chance to rehearse before the performance)!

2. Possible answers: Write the names of 4 towns of your country on the paper cards.

Put the name of the town you are representing on 1 card, on the other 3 cards please write the names of other (wrong) towns of your country.

Eurocities - Quiz (evening, start at 20.30 h)

→ Each national team chooses a speaker.

For those who perform:

- each national team performs the pantomimic representation of the three “living post cards” starting with the most difficult stage
- then (at the end) show your four possible answer cards

For those who guess:

- the other national teams can consult and guess on the answer among them
- all team speakers will be asked to give the answer
- teams with right answers will receive a point (present)

7.1.5 „Discovery Tour – Traces in Vienna”

→ Get together in the same group as on the first evening during the “Find new friends”-activity (groups “A” – “Q”).

Groups start individually from the hostel from 14.30 h onwards (public transport)

End of the tour: approximately at 18.00 h (in the city)

Each group takes a self-directed walk through the city (the group decides where to go) with a special perception focus.

The single groups watch out for traces of their specific themes (see below):

We of course encourage you to interview people in the street, go to particular places, to get information wherever you feel it might be available!
